2012 is a very good year for the TCHS Hall of Fame! We have three graduates to induct into our prestigious group. Barb Lecher Utterback ('62) and Carl Kohrt ('61) will be at our luncheon on Sept. 29th. Posthumously, Dennis Dietrich ('50) will also be inducted with his family members in attendance. This event is open to the public.

Barb Utterback was a cofounder of BETHS Place, a shelter for women and children involved in domestic violence. "She has given tirelessly of her time and emotional support to these victims since the mid-1990's," stated by Judy Wright Landeck, a classmate of Barb's who nominated her. "What began in her own home at the kitchen table led to the creation of a lovely home and safe house for victims. Barb spent countless hours with law enforcement officers, including judges and district attorneys, in order to prepare a handbook and guidelines for herself to be an advocate and to train volunteers in this position." Barb has been a parade marshall and Tuscolian of the Year for the Chamber of Commerce. Barb's community activities included: Youth Center director, member of Forty Martyrs Catholic Church, Bike-A-Thon chairman in the 70's and 80's, Tuscola Woman's Club member, Moose member and member of the Corvette Club. Barb has been married to Bob Utterback for 48 years. They've raised three daughters, Bobbi, Amy and Nicole, and have six grandchildren. Steve Hettinger('66) nominated Hall of Fame inductee, Dennis Dietrich, class of 1950. "While running a successful business and raising five children, he volunteered his time on all fronts, whatever needed done in the community, Dennis was there. When he became Chief of the Tuscola Fire Dept., he took charge with confidence and built one of the area's best fire departments," Hettinger stated. Dietrich married Jeanine Huber and raised Doug, Denise, David, Donna and Dirk. He served in the U.S. Navy (Korea), owned several small businesses in Tuscola, served as Douglas County Coroner from 1980-1994, was the sexton of Tuscola Township Cemetery from 1986-1994, and served as Tuscola Fire Chief for 33 years (1959-1994). Dietrich was named the first Tuscolian of the Year in 1966 for spearheading a search and recruitment of a local doctor. He was also

Douglas County ESDA coordinator, Douglas County Fire Assoc. President, won the State Firefighting Medal of Honor, was a member of Forty Martyrs Catholic Church, Knights of Columbus and Moose Lodge. "He was a community character and person who would be strikingly and sadly missing from the Tuscola Hall of Fame if he were not there."

Carl Kohrt, PhD., Class of 1961, was nominated by Danny Matthews (Class of 1974 and Alumni Committee Member). This gentleman was raised in a family of musicians and teachers in Tuscola. He began his professional career in 1971 with Eastman Kodak in Rochester, NY where he served in numerous senior executive, international and technical positions during his 29-year Kodak career. His tenure included leadership of Japan and Greater Asia during which time he and his wife, Lynne, were headquartered in Hong Kong and from which he led one of the largest acquisitions of Chinese commercial assets by a foreign national company up that time. He retired from Kodak in 2000. In Oct. 2001, Carl joined Battelle Memorial Inst. as the 8th President and CEO. Battelle, founded in Columbus, OH, as a charitable trust, operates one of the world's largest private research enterprises with revenues of more than \$4B, supported by a staff of more than 22,000 scientists, engineers and support staff serving more than 1,000 corporate and government customers each year. It invests in and commercializes its own, and others', intellectual property via its wholly owned but independently operated venture fund. It carries on major research with industry in infectious diseases and medical devices, energy technology, homeland security, and materials science. Carl retired from Battelle in Dec. of 2008. His professional career has been characterized by a passion for leading organizations in solving critical problems important to society through innovation, and a track record of successfully converting ideas into products that provide companies a competitive advantage. He is not constrained by organizational or geographic boundaries, but rather seeks out the best people and the best solutions on a global platform while building diverse and high performance cultures in organizations. Carl received his Bachelor of Science degree in chemistry from Furman University magna cum laude, a PhD in physical chemistry from the University of Chicago, and a Masters of Management Science from MIT. He was the recipient of a NCAA athletic scholarship, and has served as a NSF Post-Doctoral Fellow at the James Frank Institute, a NSF Graduate Fellow, a Woodrow Wilson Fellow (Hon.), a Sloan Fellow and is a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He is the recipient of two honorary Doctor of Science degrees from Ohio Dominican University







and Furman Univ. He holds four U.S. patents in imaging science. Currently, he serves as the Lead Director of Scotts MiracleGro Company, a Director of the Woodrow Wilson Foundation, and a Trustee of Furman University. Carl and Lynne, his wife of 50 years, are residents of Salem, SC. They are active supporters of the performing arts, adult literacy, and public science and math education. Their most passionate interests are reserved, however, for the families of their three sons and their ten grandchildren.




TCHS Warrior Chiefs, Hope you'll join us for Homecoming 2012!!
